## CHAPTER 4.00 - CURRICULUM AND INSTRUCTION

## 4.11 - Program of Studies

## **POLICY:**

- (1) Each high school shall offer and provide instruction for the minimum courses required to meet graduation requirements as prescribed in the Student Progression Plan of these regulations and such elective courses as may be necessary to meet the needs of students within the limits of the instructional staff of the school.
- (2) Any major change in the curriculum or program of studies of a school shall be presented to the Board and shall have approval before being put into effect.
- (3) Experimental programs are to be encouraged; however, such proposed programs shall be presented to the Board with a description of procedures and purposes and shall have approval before the program is put into operation.
- (4) The principal of each middle and high school shall present to the Superintendent the program of studies for his/her school indicating those subjects which are required and those which are electives. The program of studies for each school shall be subject to approval by the Superintendent and shall be made a part of the file for the school. When a change is desired, such additions and deletions shall be reported to the Superintendent with a request for approval.
- (5) The principal of each middle and high school shall, by the beginning of the school term, file a copy of the schedule of classes and teaching assignments. This report shall become a part of the school's files. Any change in class schedules or teaching assignments shall be reported immediately in writing to the Assistant Superintendent for Instruction.
