The School Board of Levy County met in Executive Session this 10th day of December, 2019 at 5:10 p.m. with Board Chairman Paige Brookins, Chris Cowart, Cameron Asbell, Ashley Clemenzi, Brad Etheridge and Board Attorney David Delaney present.

Expulsion Recommendations: The Board heard information regarding a recommendations for expulsion. After School Administrators Benjamin Hawkins and John Miller had given testimony, the following actions were taken by the Board.

<u>Student 20-08:</u> (student and grandparents present). After discussion from the Board Members, school administrator, student and grandparents, Chris Cowart moved to approve the recommendation of the Superintendent to expel the student for the remainder of the 2019-2020 SY and 2020-2021 SY, with the opportunity to attend the WMHS FOCUS Center and receive monthly drug tests at guardian's expense, second by Cameron Asbell, motion carried.

<u>Student 20-09:</u> (student and parent present were not present). After discussion from the Board Members and school administrator, Brad Etheridge moved to approve the recommendation of the Superintendent to expel the student for the remainder of the 2019-2020 SY and 2020-2021 SY, without educational services, second by Cameron Asbell, motion carried.

REGULAR SESSION

6:00 p.m.

The School Board of Levy County met in Regular Session this 10th day of December, 2019 at 6:00 p.m. with Board Chairman Paige Brookins, Chris Cowart, Cameron Asbell, Ashley Clemenzi, Brad Etheridge and Board Attorney David Delaney present.

Adoption of Agenda: Cameron Asbell moved to approve the agenda, second by Ashley Clemenzi, motion carried.

<u>Welcome Visitors</u>: Board Chairman Paige Brookins welcomed all the visitors and asked if anyone from the audience would like to address the Board. There were none.

Maintenance Work-Order System Software: William Stockman and Brandon Eastman gave an overview of the new maintenance work order system software. They said the new software will allow jobs and tasks for work orders to be monitored and completed in a timelier manner. The system will allow the maintenance employees and person that requested the job to monitor the progress and completion of the job on their computers and phones by using the software application. Mr. Stockman said the new Maintenance Work-Order System Software will begin July 2020. After discussion, Brad Etheridge moved to approve the purchase of the new maintenance software, second by Chris Cowart, motion carried.

Award of Bids: William Stockman and Brandon Eastman said they received one bid for the Levy DEAL and two bids for the WES Site work and paving for the fueling station.

- Levy DEAL (<u>D</u>istance learning and <u>E</u>ducational opportunities for <u>All Levy</u> students) After discussion, Chris Cowart moved to approve the bid from InCare Technologies F.K.A. Inline, second by Brad Etheridge, motion carried.
- Site work and Paving for fueling station at WES After discussion, Brad Etheridge moved to approve the bid from Jimmie Jerrels Hauling and Grading, LLC., second by Cameron Asbell, motion carried.

John Lott said SBLC received \$246,495.00 through the Levy DEAL Grant for Distance Learning equipment for the schools and District. He said we received one out of the four grants available and they will be distributed as follows: 2 each for CMHS, BMHS, WMHS and one each for CKS, YTS and the District. Mr. Lott said we can apply for the other schools for next year's grant.

Update on Florida Farm to School Conference: Julia Oberst gave a PowerPoint presentation about how students learn

to grow food from a seed, harvest it and prepare it for consumption. She said the goal is to use food grown close to home and locally grown. She said some schools currently have small gardens and the students enjoy caring for plants and watching how the food is grown. Mrs. Oberst said the problem in Levy County with Farm to School is due to the lack of services and travel distance. She said the salad bars are fresh vegetables and fresh fruit is available at all times.

Transportation Update: Gary Masters and Joe Wain said Transportation is running smoothly. They said Federal changes will take effect January 6, 2020 regarding the Federal Query on bus drivers. Mr. Wain said any positive drug tests will remain on the driver's record for five years and can be seen by the Federal, as well as the local authorities. Mr. Wain said the report follows the driver from state to state. He said CBD oil is a violation for commercial drivers and drivers can lose their CDL licenses. Mr. Wain said SBLC is a certified training facility for CDL licenses. Mr. Masters said we currently have 50 bus routes each day, including ESE routes. He said another ESE route will be added for the new year. He said the 50 routes daily don't include field trips.

<u>Drivers Education Program and Levy Virtual</u>: John Lott and Nick Stark gave a PowerPoint presentation on Blended Learning, Levy Virtual and Edgenuity classes used in the FOCUS Centers held at BMHS, CMHS, LLA, CKS, and WMHS. Mr. Stark said the classes are for ELA, math, social studies and science. Mr. Lott said Drivers Education will be added to the Virtual Program for students to begin the on-line course with the next semester. He said Kyle Parnell from CMHS will show as the teacher of record but we'll need to recruit two additional teachers to cover the program. The students will take the online class via virtual and do the driving portion in the summer.
