REGULAR SESSION

The School Board of Levy County met in Regular Session this 25th day of September, 2018 at 9:00 a.m. with Chairman Cameron Asbell, Vice Chairman Brad Etheridge, Rick Turner, Paige Brookins, Chris Cowart and Board Attorney David Delaney present.

Adoption of Agenda: Brad Etheridge moved to approve the agenda, second by Paige Brookins, motion carried.

<u>Welcome Visitors</u>: Board Chairman Cameron Asbell welcomed all the visitors and asked if anyone from the audience would like to address the Board. Terry Witt asked about the sell of WHS. Superintendent said BluRock, LLC signed a letter requesting to cancel the purchase of the property.

Florida Safe Schools Assessment Tool (FSSAT Update): Superintendent Jeff Edison informed the Board that Dennis Webber was at a Safe School Meeting, but would be presenting the District Florida Safe Schools Assessment Tool Plan (FSSAT) at the October 9th board meeting for approval. He said the district has hired Dr. Leila Pratt to provide psychological counseling for students exhibiting early warning signs or posing a threat of future violent behavior. Dr. Rosalind Hall said a flow chart has been developed and she will send it to the board members. Supt. Edison said the grant funds will be released in January 2019 for hardening. He said Levy County should receive \$192,000, which includes the charter schools, out of \$97 million. Board Attorney David Delaney said all the emergency information is available to the schools and law enforcement, but not the public.

<u>Classroom Safety in Case of Emergencies:</u> SRO Keith Osteen shared his "Bucket Supplies" sample, which includes some of emergency supplies being collected for each classroom. These supplies can be used if the schools are in "lock down". He said Lowes donated the buckets and the community is donating supplies to provide each classroom in Bronson with a bucket of supplies.

District Facilities Committee: John Lott, Assistant Superintendent informed the Board that the state has suggested we create a District Facilities Committee as we continue our process to obtain special facilities funding for a new Chiefland Middle High School. The committee members consist of Bronson – John Meeks, Chiefland – Osborn Barker, Cedar Key – Ted Alexander, Williston – Desiree Mills, and Yankeetown – Diana Pearson. After discussion, Paige Brookins moved to approve creating the committee and the committee members, second by Chris Cowart, motion carried.

Revised Annual Financial Report FYE 2017-2018: Kim Lake, Director of Finance, updated the Board on the minor change in the Annual Financial Report fiscal year ending 2017-2018.

Public Hearing: Legislative Platform Development: Superintendent Jeff Edison said we have been working on the new Legislative Platform for Levy County for 2018-2019 and the final platform needs to be approved at the October 9, 2018 Board Meeting. Chris Cowart, Board Member and Florida School Board Association's representative for Levy County School Board, shared some of the proposed FSBA 2019 Legislative Platform, which includes School Safety, Mental Health, Funding and Millage Rates, Personnel, and Increase the Base Student Allocation. Superintendent Edison said a link is set up on the SBLC website for the public to make comments and/or suggestions for the Legislative Platform; however, no comments have been added. Mr. Edison said we will have a representative to assist with finalizing the Levy County Legislative Platform at the October 9, 2018 Board Meeting.

Superintendent's Comments/Recommendations: Superintendent Jeffery Edison said shared a draft copy of the CORE Values for SBLC and said the final will come before the Board for approval soon. He said Personnel is researching the possibility of using Kelly Temporary Services or other temporary agencies to employee substitutes. He said we currently have a shortage on subs and have to pull paraprofessionals from other classrooms. Mr. Edison said the temporary agency will process all the paperwork for hiring an employee and provide SBLC with the subs. He said the subs provided by the agency would be able to work throughout the year, including summers and up to five days per week. Mr. Edison shared a MOU for Emergency Counseling Services and said it will include the Superintendents from six school districts, Levy, Dixie, Lafayette, Gilchrist, Suwannee and Taylor counties. He said Candy Dean is working the SACS Accreditation, which begins October 22, 2018. He said our Strategic Plan is out of compliance. The last one was completed seven years ago and the Board will be involved with the new Strategic Plan for Levy County.

Board Comments: Brad Etheridge said he is happy the new school year is running smoothly. Rick Turner said he's counting down to vacating his seat and turning it over to the new Board Member. He said he has been amazed and pleased at the in-depth concern of the other Board Members for students' success. He said Cameron is doing a great job representing Levy County on the VAB. Paige Brookins congratulated CMHS athletes for being undefeated. She said CES' Fall Festival is Friday night, September 29th and CMHS homecoming is Friday, October 5th. She said 21 dual enrollment students attended the ACT Boot Camp. Chris Cowart thanked Rick Turner for his comments. He thanked all the Board Members for assisting and supporting him during the past six

years as a Board Member. He said the Beast Feast is October 20th at the Etheridge Farm and Produce in Williston and the Cedar Key Seafood Festival is October 20-21. Cameron Asbell said Bronson FFA is hosting a fishing tournament on October 13th. He said the Levy County Prevention Coalition has eight counselors throughout Levy County to provide services to students who are in need of assistance in many areas, such as mental, health, drugs, etc. The Board thanked Jonathan Lewis and the Coalition for their assistance.
